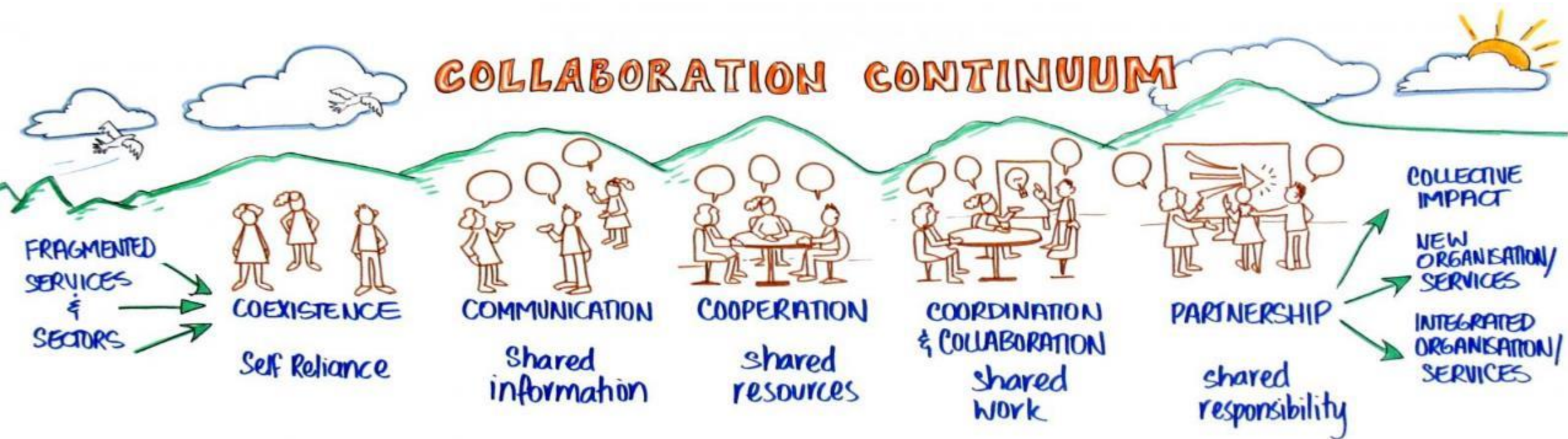


Interagency Project Goals

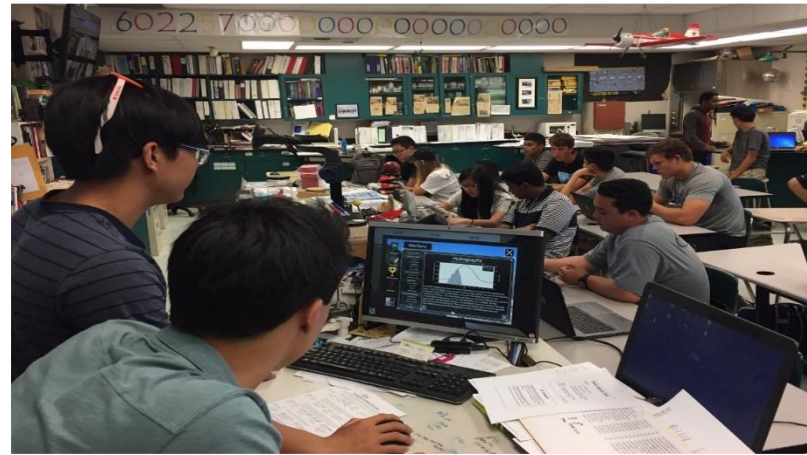

Twenty-One Mile Dam Failure (Nevada, 2017)

- Center Breach area was about 50 feet wide and 40 feet deep.
- The Main Breach is located near the right abutment was about 120 feet wide and greater than 50 feet in depth.
- Over 1.5 inches of rain on top of snow that was melting. (~680 square mile watershed).

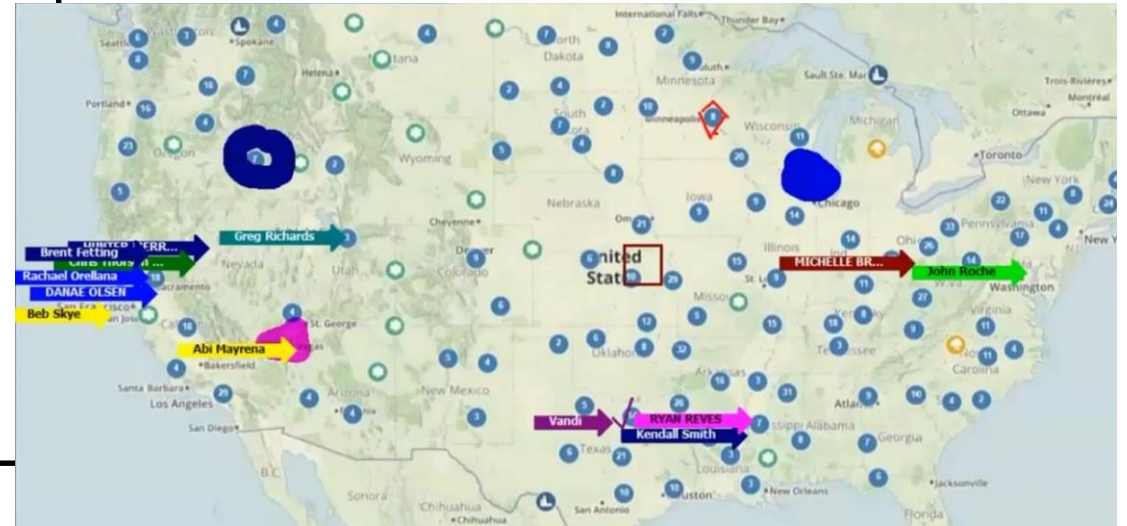

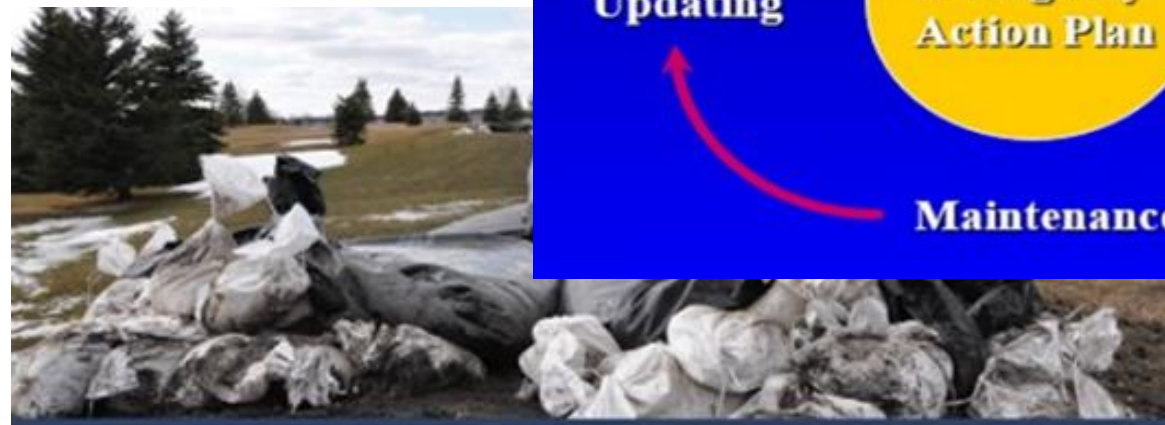

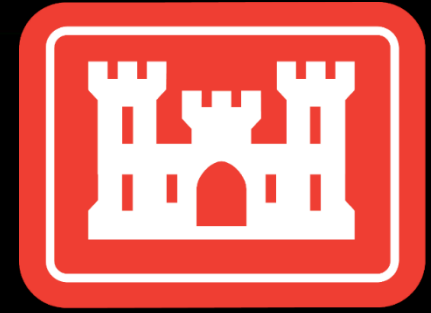
