Minden, NV – Douglas County, Nevada, hosts an educational flood awareness event to provide residents and businesses in the county with current information and resources to prepare and respond effectively during possible flooding situations. The Flood Awareness event takes place Tuesday, November 14, 2023, from 3:00 – 5:30 p.m. at the Douglas County Community Center, located at 329 Waterloo Lane, in Gardner-ville, Nevada.

The Douglas County Stormwater management team will specifically address flood preparedness as it relates to the following:

- Carson River Physical Map Revision
- Smelter Creek Flood Map Revision
- Pinenut Creek Flood Detention Feasibility Study
- Buckeye Creek Upstream Detention Feasibility Design
- Douglas County Stormwater Master Plan

The information available during the event includes flood insurance, flood preparedness, showcasing the flood model, identifying flood zones for properties, and mapping updates.

Representatives from Douglas County Stormwater, East Fork Fire Protection District, Nevada Department of Transportation, Nevada Division of Water Resources, Army Corps of Engineers, Carson Water Subconservancy District, Nevada Division of Emergency Management, FEMA National Flood Insurance Program, University of Nevada Cooperative Extension, National Weather Service, and more are available to answer flood-related questions.

"Bringing vital information as it relates to flood awareness and preparedness is the goal of this program," said Douglas County Stormwater Program Manager, Courtney Walker. "In partnering with the state and our local agencies, holding an event such as this is a great way to provide information about flooding issues as it relates to our community to be better prepared when we're impacted by flooding."

Douglas County, Nevada, a community to match the scenery, is centrally located just 15 minutes south of Nevada's state capital and borders Lake Tahoe. Located on Nevada's western border, the community is framed by the Carson Range of the Sierra Nevada to the west and the Pine Nut Mountains to the east. Governor's Proclamation



A Proclamation by the Governor

WHEREAS, flooding creates emergencies of great concern to the State of Nevada, with imminent threat to life and property, as well as the potential for hundreds of millions of dollars in damage to homes, businesses, and local community infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, since 1955, Nevada has received 19 presidential disaster declarations related to flooding. With 2023 marking the sixth year since Northern Nevada's devastating floods of 2017; and this spring brought extreme snow melt following a record-breaking snowpack accumulated over the winter leading to Nevada's 19th presidentially declared disaster related flooding, we impart the need to remain vigilant against such disasters; and

WHEREAS, Nevada continues to take critical steps to address climate change, the risk of more hazardous and frequent flooding remains a constant threat to people, property, and the natural environment; and

WHEREAS, flood hazard, flood risk reduction, vulnerability, and preparedness information are available from local, state, and federal partners and should be studied and observed throughout the year to reduce the impacts of flooding to communities, lives, and property; and

WHEREAS, the Nevada Flood Awareness Committee is committed to developing comprehensive and sustainable solutions to flood hazard issues, including flood awareness and outreach activities, flood hazard mitigation planning and projects, floodplain management and flood and inundation mapping; and

WHEREAS, the Nevada Flood Awareness Committee continues to engage and inform Nevadans about how to prepare before, during, and after floods, as well as the importance of flood insurance to help create safer and more resilient communities; and ask all Nevadans to observe Nevada Floods Awareness Week by preparing their homes and communities for floods;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOE LOMBARDO, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, do hereby proclaim the week of November 12-18, 2023 as
